9.5 Resolution to Expedite MDRA Funding

WHEREAS, the Township of Joly experienced a natural disaster event on June 22nd to June 23rd 2024 and again on July 7th 2025, which caused significant damage to public roads which have grossly exceeded the Municipal budget. This has now been the second once in a lifetime storm in two consecutive years;

WHEREAS, the funding parameters of the MDRA funding program are not realistic for the current climate changes the world is facing and need to be increased and improved;

WHEREAS, the application is difficult and time consuming for small rural townships with limited staffing resources;

WHEREAS, the lengthy turn around to obtain funding approval poses extreme hardships on small rural Northern Ontario Municipalities that systemically discriminates against rural residents;

WHEREAS, the damage assessment conducted by municipal authorities indicates an urgent need for recovery and rehabilitation of affected areas.

WHEREAS, the Province provides financial support through the Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance (MDRA) program to assist municipalities in recovering from unexpected disasters and emergencies; and

WHEREAS, due to the severity and urgency of the situation, it is in the best interest of the Municipality and its residents to request expedited processing and release of funding from the MDRA program to enable prompt recovery operations and ensure public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Corporation of the township of Joly, in a regular session assembled, that:

The Municipality formally calls on and requests financial assistance under the Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance (MDRA) program for the damages and costs resulting from the disaster events on June 22nd – June 23rd 2024.

AND FURTHER Council requests that the processing and disbursement of MDRA funds be expedited to allow immediate implementation of recovery and rehabilitation activities. Council direct the Municipal Administrator to:

Take all appropriate actions in coordination with relevant agencies to facilitate the swift release and use of funds.
