

THE TOWNSHIP OF JOLY

2021 BUDGET REPORT – PUBLIC MEETING

This Public Meeting is to provide ratepayers and residents an opportunity to discuss and question the proposed annual budget prior to adoption. This meeting has been advertised, as required with this report also posted on the website.

The 2021 proposed budget includes more capital projects than in recent years and Council has maintained the average increase to 2.1%.

In order to maintain a 2.1% increase, all of the 2020 surplus and almost \$125,000 is being transferred from reserves.

Included in the 2021 budget are several Joly capital projects.

- 1 The Township was successful with an application and will receive money to complete upgrades at Lynch Lake Beach. This entire project will be completed using money from the Provincial and Federal Government.
- 2 Funding previously received for "Main Street Improvements" will be used this year in accordance with the funding agreement. This project will be completed using funding only.
- 3 The Forest Lake Road surface treatment project including pulverizing the existing surface, ditching along this section and a lift of gravel are planned for 2021. Based on survey results received in 2019, Council has designated the "one-time only funding" received from the Provincial Government to cover a portion of the cost of this project.
- 4 Some Joly seasonal and year-round roads will receive a lift of gravel. This project, in addition to tax dollars, will use the funding received through the OCIF formula component program and Gax Tax funding.
